ORDINANCE NO. 2021-O-069

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAREDO, TEXAS AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2020-O-131 REGARDING THE VOLUNTARY DRUG TESTING FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF LAREDO TO INCLUDE CHANGES IN FREQUENCY OF TESTING; CHANGES IN TESTING PROCEDURES; APPROVING CHANGES TO THE DRUG TESTING FORM; APPROVING THE VOLUNTARY DRUG TESTING WITHDRAWAL FORM; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Laredo recognizes the adverse impact drug and alcohol abuse can have on the community; and

WHEREAS, it is the joint responsibility of the City of Laredo and its elected officials to ensure the public trust and safety of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, drug and alcohol abuse can result in a decrease in the City's efficiency, economy, and productivity; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to maintain a drug free workplace, the City of Laredo has implemented the Drug and Alcohol Testing Program to meet this objective; and

WHEREAS, on October 19, 2020, the City Council approved Ordinance No. 2020-O-131 establishing a voluntary drug testing process for elected officials to elect to voluntarily participate in the program in order to ensure the citizens of Laredo that elected officials are performing at the highest standards; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2020-O-131 requires members of Council to be tested for both urine and hair follicle on a monthly basis yet hair follicle testing goes back up to six months and is costlier; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes the voluntary drug testing process should be amended to provide for clarification in frequency of testing and establish more streamlined testing procedures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAREDO, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. Voluntary Drug Testing for Elected Officials.

(a) **Definitions.** For the purpose of this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

"Elected official" shall include those members elected at large by the qualified voters of the City of Laredo which includes members of the City Council, the Mayor, and the Municipal Court Judge.

- (b) Voluntary Participation. Elected officials shall be required to fill out the "Voluntary Drug Testing" form stating whether they decide to opt in or out of voluntary testing; said form shall be made publicly available on the City of Laredo Website. If an elected official does not submit the Voluntary Drug Testing Form it shall state "Elected Official has not volunteered" on the City of Laredo Website. The names of those elected officials who elect to be tested will be entered into the software program used by the City to randomly select individuals and schedule the testing. An elected official who previously opted into the voluntary drug testing program may withdraw from the program but must submit documentation of withdrawal to the Human Resources Department. If an Elected Official submits the Voluntary Drug Testing Withdrawal Form to the Human Resources Department, it shall state "Elected Official has withdrawn from program" on the City of Laredo website.
- (c) Frequency of Testing. Three elected officials shall be randomly selected each month for urine sample testing beginning one month after the passage of this Ordinance. If an elected official volunteers to submit to hair follicle testing, such testing will occur once every six (6) months with the first round of testing occurring in January and the second round of testing occurring in July. Half of elected officials who submit to hair follicle testing will be required to test in the first round of testing. If an elected official is selected for hair follicle testing in the first round of testing, they may not be selected to test for the second round of testing.
- (d) **Selection of Testing.** Selection and testing shall occur only on a day which a City Council meeting is scheduled. Elected officials who are selected by the program will be notified of their selection by 4:00 PM on the day they are selected prior to the City Council meeting.
- (e) **Time to Report**. Elected officials selected to test will have <u>to test the day they are 2 hours</u> after being notified to report to testing at the City designated facility <u>but must report to testing prior to the start of the City Council meeting</u>. If an elected official selected for testing is unable to submit to testing after being notified, they must submit an affidavit to the Human Resources Director <u>or their designee</u>, within twenty-four (24) hours of their failure to test, asserting the reason they were unable to report to testing. <u>Failure to submit for testing or provide an affidavit to the Human Resources Director shall be noted on the City of Laredo Website</u>.
- (f) **Testing.** Testing will be conducted by licensed testing facility employees at a location designated by the City where a scheduled City Council meeting will be held, <u>City Council Chambers</u>, or at a City approved location of the elected official's choice. Elected officials shall have the option to submit a urine or hair follicle sample for testing.
- (g) Written Request for Re-testing. An elected official who tests positive for drugs may request that the split specimen be analyzed; such request must be submitted to the Human Resources Director within twenty-four (24) hours of the notification of the original positive result.

(h) **Publication of Test Results**. Publication of results are subject to the written consent of the elected official. Voluntary drug test results will be published on the City of Laredo website. In the event written consent is not provided, results will state "Results not released" on the City of Laredo website.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Voluntary Drug Test Form. The City Council hereby adopts the form attached to this ordinance as Exhibit "A" and incorporates same herein by reference to be the City of Laredo's Voluntary Drug Test Form for elected officials.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> Voluntary Drug Testing Withdrawal Form. The City Council hereby adopts the form attached to this ordinance as Exhibit "B" and incorporates same herein by reference to be the City of Laredo's Voluntary Drug Testing Withdrawal Form for elected officials.

SECTION 4. That if any of these sections, provisions, sentences, clauses, phrases or parts are held unconstitutional or void, such holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions or sections of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. That all ordinances that are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, repealed and all other ordinances of the City not in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

SUBJECT

2021-O-069 An Ordinance of the City of Laredo, Texas amending Ordinance No. 2020-O-131 regarding the voluntary drug testing for elected officials of the City of Laredo to include changes in frequency of testing; changes in testing procedures; approving changes to the drug testing form; providing a severability clause and providing an effective date.

PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION

During the March 1, 2021 City Council meeting, City Council motioned to proceed as presented.

BACKGROUND

During the City Council meeting of October 19, 2020, City Council motioned to accept the ordinance which would allow elected City officials to opt into a voluntary drug testing process.

This proposed ordinance would include a voluntary drug testing process for all elected official of the City of Laredo. All elected officials shall be required to fill out the amended "Voluntary Drug Testing" form stating whether they decided to opt in or out of the voluntary testing. This form and the testing results shall be made publicly available on the City of Laredo City Secretary website. Elected officials who elect to submit to the voluntary drug testing process would be randomly selected and testing wold occur on a monthly basis at any scheduled City Council meeting.

This amendment would modify the following, if an elected official does not fill out and submit the Voluntary Drug Testing form it shall state, "Elected Official has not volunteered" on the City of Laredo Website; elected officials may withdraw from drug test participation by submitting the Voluntary Withdraw Drug Testing form; frequency of testing, if an elected official volunteers to submit to hair follicle testing, such testing will be conducted once every six (6) months with the first round of testing occurring in January and the second round of testing occurring in July. If an elected official is selected for hair follicle testing in the first round of testing, they may not be selected to test for the second round of testing. Half of the volunteering elected officials will be

tested on the first round in January and the remaining second half volunteering will be tested in July; with three (3) elected officials being selected for random urine drug test once a month; testing can be at the vendors location, City Council Chamber or at the elected officials choice.
