ORDINANCE NO. 2023-O-065

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAREDO, TEXAS, AMENDING ORDINANCE 2021-O-069, VOLUNTARY DRUG TESTING FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS, BY CHANGING THE NUMBER OF ELECTED OFFICIALS DRUG TESTED EACH MONTH FROM THREE TO ONE; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE CUMULATIVE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council approved Ordinance No. 2021-O-069, which amended Ordinance No. 2020-O-131.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2021-O-069 requires three elected officials be randomly selected each month for urine samples.

WHEREAS, the City Council believes the Frequency of Testing section of the Voluntary Drug Testing policy should be amended because only four elected officials are enrolled in the voluntary drug testing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAREDO, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. Voluntary Drug Testing for Elected Officials

- (a) **Definitions**. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:
 - "Elected Official" shall include those members elected at large by the qualified voters of the City of Laredo which includes members of the City Council, the Mayor, and the Municipal Court Judge.
- (b) Voluntary Participation. Elected officials shall be required to fill out the "Voluntary Drug Testing" form stating whether they decide to opt in or out of the voluntary testing; said form shall be made publicly available on the City of Laredo website. If an elected official does not submit the Voluntary Drug Testing Form it shall state "Elected Official has not volunteered" on the City of Laredo website. The names of those elected officials who elect to be tested will be entered into the software program used by the City to randomly select individuals and schedule the testing. An elected official who previously opted into the voluntary drug testing program may withdraw from the program but must submit documentation of withdrawal to the Human Resources Department. If an elected official submits the Voluntary Drug Testing Withdrawal Form to the Human Resources Department, it shall state "Elected Official has withdrawn from program" on the City of Laredo website.
- (c) Frequency of Testing. [Three] One (1) elected officials shall be randomly selected each month for urine sample testing beginning one month after the passage of this Ordinance. If an elected official volunteer to submit hair follicle testing, such testing will occur once every six (6) months with the first round of testing occurring in January and the second round of testing occurring in July. Half of elected officials who submit to hair follicle testing will be required to test in the first round of testing. If an elected official

is selected for hair follicle testing in the first round of testing, they may not be selected to test for the second round of testing.

- (d) **Selection of Testing**. Selection and testing shall occur only on a day which a City Council is scheduled. Elected Officials who are selected by the program will be notified of their selection prior to the City Council meeting.
- (e) **Time to Report**. Elected Officials selected to test will have to test the day they notified to report to testing at the City designated facility but report to testing prior to the start of the City Council meeting. If an elected official selected for testing is unable to submit to testing after being notified, they must submit an affidavit to the Human Resources Department or their designee, within twenty-four (24) hours of failure to test, asserting the reason they were unable to report to testing. Failure to submit for testing or provide an affidavit to the Human Resources Director shall be noted on the City of Laredo Website.
- (f) **Testing**. Testing will be conducted by licensed testing facility employees at a location designated by the City where a scheduled City Council meeting will be held, City Council Chambers, or at a City approved location of the elected official's choice. Elected officials shall have the option to submit a urine or hair follicle sample for testing.
- (g) Written Request for Re-Testing. An elected official who tests positive for drugs may request that the split specimen be analyzed; such request must be submitted to the Human Resources Director within twenty-four (24) hours of notification of the original positive result.
- (h) **Publication of Test Results.** Publication of results are subject to the written consent of the elected official. Voluntary drug test results will be published on the City of Laredo website. In the event written consent is not provided, results will state "Results not released" on the City of Laredo website.
 - <u>Section 2.</u> This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances of the City of Laredo, Texas, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed.
 - Section 3. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.

•	I understand that I must report to testing at the City designated testing facility on the day that I am notified to test and must do so prior to the start of the City Council meeting. It I am unable to submit to testing I must submit an affidavit to the Human Resources Director within twenty-four (24) hours notifying them of the reason I was unable to report to testing.
•	I understand and agree that the licensed testing facility shall release the test results to the City of Laredo.
•	Once test results are released to the City of Laredo, I, : grant do not grant
	permission to the City of Laredo to post the results of this voluntary drug test to the City of Laredo website.
•	I understand that:
	 I may refuse to volunteer in this program. I can revoke my authorization electing to participate in this program at any time. My signing this document is voluntary.
