X. COMMUNICATIONS

B. Requests by Councilmember Louis H. Bruni

1. Report on all stolen tractor trailers in the City of Laredo with possible action.

Cm. Bruni read a letter he had addressed to Carlos Villarreal, Assistant City Manager, in reference to stolen tractor trailers where he was asking for a list of stolen tractor trailers, plus a list of the status of police investigations that are ongoing or solved, a list of all persons arrested or suspected of this act from 1994 through 1996 and had not received a response from staff or the City Manager's Office. He asked what staff has done pertaining to his request, if they have something to present to him tonight and wanted to hear from the Chief of Police of what he has been doing to advert these problems that seem to be plaguing the community.

Mr. Vargas replied that staff had faxed and mailed a report this afternoon.

J.L. Martinez, Chief of Police, stated that he had just provided the report to Mr. Vargas today. They have investigated about 32 cases of cargo theft since 1994, they have recovered 7 tractors and 17 trailers with merchandise. They have arrested 12 people with felony theft as a result of those investigations. There are four outstanding warrants for that same offense. They have ongoing investigations on organized criminal activity with the FBI on these investigations.

Dr. Hector Farias, Jr., President of the Texas-Mexican Border International Trade Association, stated that this problem has accelerated and that the City of Laredo has done much by taking in funds from federal and state agencies to combat this crime. He added that even though the sheriff says that we need a task force within a task force, there is already a task force that has been in existence for some time. The task force comprises of the Sheriff's Office, the Chief of Police, the District Attorney, and DPS. He added that we do not need another task force. In his opinion what we need is that the task force concentrate on the theft of trailers. The reason it is not taking place is because only the city is involved in trailer thefts, and only the city has taken advantage of the funds that have been available every year for the past six years. He concluded by asking for the city's assistance since this is the only responsible law agency doing its part because the county says they have no jurisdiction and that the majority is within the city limits. He asked who's responsibility is it? He urged council to take a close look at what they bring to this community because if our tax base is affected by the shifting of commodities to other ports we are all in serious trouble.

Cm. Casso wants a report from staff on what the status is on the four outstanding warrants for the same offense which

have been turned over to the District Attorney's office for prosecution. He also wants a report on the radio system, how much it costs, what kind of a system it is, how many megahertz, whether it is digital, and what we paid for it? He wants the President of the Police Association to come before this City Council to share views on this issue, because they state they are not happy with the radio system.

Status report on the street lighting for Arkansas Avenue and Loop 20 with possible action.

Mr. Luis Landin, Traffic Manager, stated that on Arkansas Avenue they will try to see if they can bring up the illumine from the 16,000 illumine that they have there to illuminate the roadway. On 359 to 83 and Loop 20 there are 40 lights that they are going to install in that portion of the road that now has curb and gutter and is on the last phase of being constructed, they already have the conduits underneath the roadway so when they get the proposal from CPL the will bring it to the City Manager with cost estimates. On Los Presidentes and on Century City the Highway Department is going to install two signals there and upgrade the one on 83 and Loop 20.

- (4) Want to assure that women are fairly represented in our library, they have met with members to discuss

- having a selection of the new library to include women and women's issues.
- (5) They are monitoring federal/state legislation, city policies, ordinances, and resolution affecting women.
- (6) They are reviewing the Laredo City Council minutes and budgets to determine what impact their decisions are having on the women of Laredo.
- (7) The read world, national, and state statistics, but are not sure how to obtain statistics on Laredo women so they can measure their progress and improve the status of women in Laredo.

They have identified the needs and concerns of women, develop and access strategies including community outreach activities, public/private partnerships, coordination of community and state resources and recommend assistance and services to improve the status of women in Laredo. Because they need to focus in one issue to assure success, they identified the woman's issue of domestic violence. They presented the action plan to significantly reduce incidents of domestic violence in particular that directed to women. They have joined forces with Webb County Domestic Violence Task Force to eliminate duplication of efforts.

They have a established a Women's Hall of Fame in Laredo, ten women were honored last year and this year they will honor 11 women into the Laredo Women's Hall of Fame, Natalie C. Burkhalter, Guadalupe G. Castaneda, Elizabeth G. "Betty" Flores, Altagracia Azios Garcia, Lydia G. Gonzalez, Anita L. Martin, Cecilia May Moreno, Peggy J. Newman, Katy Profit, Graciela C.
