Mr. Frank Saldaña, a local attorney, posed a question to council and asked that it be taken into consideration. The question was concerning the designation of who the members are, creating at the least the appearance of impropriety to have Cm. Bruni sit on the committee where he is a trustee of the Bruni Mineral Trust which is one of the biggest mineral owners in Webb County. In addition to that, he stated that Mr. Bruni having a construction company seems to him that certainly a question could be raised as to whether it appears improper. It seems to him where someone who has a direct financial interest in the industry in minerals in Webb County, being one of the persons that the oil company has to come to clear the requirements, it is going to make them feel very awkward.

Mayor Ramirez explained the charge of this committee, which is reviewing the drilling permits for drilling within the City of Laredo city limits and on property of the City of Laredo. The only reviews that this committee would be looking at would be whether they meet the boundaries of the ordinances that already exist and adopted by the City Council.

Fausto Sosa, City Attorney, remarked that with respect to the creation of the Ad Hoc Committee, he said it is more of an advisory for City Council as a whole. He said that Mr. Saldana's point is well taken and that any time any councilmember has a conflict of interest or has a substantial interest in a business that can be impacted by whatever decision is made, a disclosure must be made according to the law and abstained from voting. That is not only at the Ad Hoc Committee level, but when you are going to the ultimate and final matter that you are going to vote on.

Mr. Saldaña stated that he is not saying that Cm. Bruni is going to have a direct conflict of interest which is unlikely, but it is just more the appearance of it and the light that it casts the city.

Mayor Ramirez announced that Mr. Saldana's suggestion will be taken into advisement and will have the legal department prepare an opinion.

Cm. Bruni stated for the record, "the Bruni Mineral Trust of which I am a trustee, one of two, does not do any business with the oil and gas companies that have done business with the City of Laredo. So I have nothing to gain and the city can gain a little bit through my daily dealings with oil companies, some of which are very ethical and some of which are very unethical, just like some attorneys are ethical and some are not very ethical. My sole reason in trying to create this committee is to protect the interests of the City of Laredo."

Florencio Pena, Administrative Services Director, stated that they will enter into a contract with RM Personnel and they will be responsible for workers' compensation, payroll taxes, etc. He added that the contract does provide for them to provide us people that are qualified within 24 hours and if they are not able to, there is a 30 day termination provision in the contract for failure to perform.

Mrs. Cindy Ramirez, President of BPR, stated that she was willing to re-negotiate her rate and for council consideration due to the fact that she has been providing good service to the city departments.

Fausto Sosa, City Attorney, stated that the proposed contract is still being reviewed, there is still some issues that need to be resolved and one of them is the payment of the taxes and the withholdings which is something that the contract does not address, other than to state that all of the laws

will be complied with by independent contractors, there is no safeguard but it is a matter of drafting.

Ms. Monica Palacios of RM Personnel was present to answer any questions in reference to their corporation. She said they do abide with all federal and local regulations, they provide the clients with any type of reports that are needed to prove earnings that are reported to IRS, if necessary. They do comply and offer all their employees whether temporary or leased with medical insurance, safety training, health benefits and assured the council that the 24-hour placement is basically their maximum.

Cm. Castaneda suggested that the City Attorney and the Administrative Services Director work out proper documents that safeguards what has been discussed.

COMMUNICATIONS Χ.

Cm. Guerra expressed his concern on a fax communication which was sent by Mr. Vargas. The item concerned the letters from the Mr. Robert Fuller where he expressed concerned about the 1983 Waterworks Revenue Bonds Series of \$600,000.00 and about the \$3.1 million City Sewer System Revenue Bonds Series 1978. The concern stands from the fact that the rating outlook for the longer term is negative and he would like to know what this means.

Mayor Ramirez stated that there are hearings scheduled for later in the agenda that deal specifically with water and sewer and asked that this discussion be held until the public hearings.

Cm. Casso stated that on December 19th he requested from staff a blueprint of his district, but that he has not received it yet.

Mr. Vargas answered that they had already provided the blueprints to council, but that they will give Cm. Casso another copy.

XI. CITY COUNCIL DISCUSSION AND PRESENTATION

26. Request by Mayor and City Councilmembers for discussion and presentation.

A. Request By Councilmember Louis H. Bruni

1. Report on the 14" water main break at the corner of Bartlett and Stewart.

Tomas Rodriguez, Utilities Director, reported that the break occurred on August 30, 1995 at the 2500th block of North Bartlett. The 14" water transmission main is a cast iron pipe approximately 40 to 50 years old. It delivers water from Gustavus to Lyon (2200 to 2900 blocks of N. Bartlett) from a 16" to a series of 6", 8", 10", and 12" water distribution mains. According to their records, this was the first time that the 14" line had ruptured. The report stated that it did inconvenience the least amount of people, but it provided water even though it was at lower pressure.

Cm. Bruni wanted to know who's responsibility is it to check to make sure that when there is an emergency, the manholes or valves that have to be accessed have no asphalt and can be readily and easily found. He suggested that Mr. Rodriguez and Public Works staff make a study on how many valves have asphalt on top of them and that this valved be located because the Heights Area is prone to this type of problem.

Mr. Rodriguez stated that the study has already started and that it should be completed within the next nine months.

B. Request By Councilmember Cecilia May Moreno

1. Status report on the construction of the Buenos Aires Center.

Mr. Rogelio Rivera, City Engineer, stated that bids will be received by September 14, 1995 and will be approved by council by September 18, 1995.

2. Request for the cleaning of the channelized creek at the corner of San Dario and Lyon.

Cw. Moreno pointed out that it is not San Dario and Lyon, but San Dario and Jefferson, the area has a lot of debri.

Joe Guerra, Public Works Director, answered that they will take care of it as soon as they get there, that they have a

schedule that they have to follow, it might be in a month or two. He will provide a schedule by the next council meeting of which creeks were cleaned and when the creek is scheduled to be cleaned.

3. Request to discuss timeline for the implementation of the additional equipment, manpower etc. for the cleaning of additional creek areas throughout the City.

Cw. Moreno said that they are looking to increase the amount of manpower and equipment, but that those funds won't be in for a while, she asked if this means that they have to wait for months before these areas are cleaned.

Mr. Vargas reported that they will have the increase in tolls effective in November, at that same time they can start the process to hire the personnel. They are in the process now of identifying the availability of equipment so they may be able to purchase the equipment before that, as soon as they get the revenues in, they can put the crews to work probably within six weeks of November. He was talking about two additional crews for creek cleaning.

Mr. Vargas explained that equipment needs to be purchased for this activity and additional personnel needs to be hired. That in the budget hearings council had proposed they include equipment for these crews and obviously, they will not buy the equipment until the budget is approved.

Cm. Casso suggested that they take funds out of the general fund and then reimburse the general fund later.

Joe Guerra, Public Works Director, stated that there are 27 creeks to be cleaned and not enough equipment or manpower to clean them.

Cm. Casso questioned in reference to privately owned creeks.

Mr. Vargas stated they will receive an updated map of privately owned creeks. They will provide council with a schedule for the two work crews of when they will hire them and when they will start, and a schedule of their work.

C. Request By Councilmember Joe A. Guerra

 Discussion and possible action concerning the refunding of water deposits to citizens which are in good standing with the City.

Mr. Vargas felt that it this request is appropriate and that staff would bring to council an ordinance to accomplish what Cm. Guerra is proposing which is that after a year, which is the term that CPL uses, that once there is an established

one year credit history you get refunded the majority of your deposit.

Mayor Ramirez stated that we should set up parameters to deal with, for example, if one has to refund them their delinquent or what we are going to do if it is reapplied at another location that they are moving to but they are in charge of water, and is it only for personal accounts or commercial as well. Those parameters are set that deal specifically to what Cm. Guerra wants to accomplish and not go over board in trying to accomplish them, we want to reward the customers that are of good standing.

Mrs. Phyllis Colon, Tax Assessor/Collector, explained that the way the ordinance was set-up when it went from \$30 to \$100. They did request that people pay the difference and this is what brought the problem. Say you had 20 years of good experience at your location transferred to a new place, Mr. Vargas had requested that we look very carefully at this and he took it on himself to say, I authorize you in this case to transfer the deposit from one location to another. So they have done that, people that had \$30.00 down and went to a new location and had an excellent paying record were using those \$30.00 rate at the same place. Their projection is that they would refund \$70.00 if they have a good payment account for a year.
