Mr. Bernabe Somoza of Houston made the presentation. He stated that they have been producing concerts in four states, eight to ten in Texas and that the City of Laredo will not incur a financial risk.

Cm. Casso had questions on the term of the lease and in terms of cost if the city is responsible for all electrical, water, and sewage utilities and if the city also provides personnel to clean-up the facilities.

Mr. Nava stated that they will provide him with figures on the cost and that they have a contract for clean-up.

Salvador Tellez, City Attorney, asked the promoter to clarify Mr. Casso's question. He stated the one thing is the Termination Clause which says you have 90 days to terminate a contract, however an exercise option clause is not the same thing as a termination clause. He asked Mr. Zamosa what is the time frame that they use to notify the municipality or the governmental subdivision that they are going to exercise that option, to use the next year's date, or how far in advance do they normally give notice. He added one clause is to cancel the other one is to let us know that they will be using that date. If we can live with that time frame, maybe we can incorporate it into the final reading.

XI. CITY COUNCIL DISCUSSION AND PRESENTATION

Request by Mayor and City Councilmembers for discussion and presentation.

A. Request by Councilmember Joe A. Guerra

Status report on the extension of Del Mar Boulevard to the new Alexander High School.

Mr. Vargas submitted a memorandum from the Engineering Department to the City Council on the status of Del Mar Boulevard to the new Alexander High School. He stated that they have finalized the design plans for the reconstruction and that probably next week they will begin the utility relocation, also some of the construction for box culverts because we have three major areas where we are going to have to provide for drainage from the north to the south. He added that they have been in contact with the property owners on the front end of the property because they would like to have that at final design which is essentially five lanes, with the property owners paying for the difference (for the first 1000 feet). Mr. Vargas added that they will maintain the road open for two lanes at all times during the construction.

Mr. Vargas mentioned that he had spoken to several members of the Board of Education about the possibility of taking extra precautions to provide for a safety environment for the cars, primarily during the morning drive time and afternoon drive time. He stated that they have tried to expedite this project as soon as possible, but that it is impossible to have the project completed by late August or early September because of all the drainage involved.

Cm. Guerra suggested that the road be provided with caliche on both sides so that we can have some type of shoulders for emergency stops. He asked that the Engineering Department look into this possibility and come back with a recommendation at the next meeting.

Mr. Vargas stated that more patrols will be present to expedite the flow of traffic.

Mayor Ramirez asked that the Engineering Department prepare this report and circulate the information to Cm. Guerra and if he deems necessary to bring it back to council he will and if not, they can proceed accordingly.

Mr. Dave Davis asked why wasn't the timetable for the school taken into account in deciding when to begin construction?

Mr. Vargas stated that the city was never consulted about the construction of the J.B. Alexander School out there. The reason that the City Council approved the reconstruction of an existing road was because the Texas A & M University requested that this road be reconstructed in the event that the inner loop would not be constructed in time for the opening of the university campus. He added that was when the council authorized us to incorporate it into this year's budget, hopefully to build the road as soon as possible.

Cm. Bruni stated for the record that the road is in deplorable condition and it is a very dangerous road. He asked that the presence of the police department be out there for traffic safety.

Mike Kramer stated that in 1992 when McPherson was being reengineered, the Army Corp of Engineers, paid for an expensive study of drainage including the tributaries that lead from that particular area. At the same time U.I.S.D was negotiating with bidders for the award of J.B. Alexander. He stated that it seems to him that at the same time the Army Corp of Engineers was doing work for McPherson that they could have been doing the same work in preparation for the street to be redone by the city for this extension out to J.B. Alexander.

Mayor Ramirez pointed out that the City Charter, except for grant type of designations does not allow us to improve right-of-ways except those that are the city's. Most of that right-of-way ends up being part of the county or was, since that time we have moved into that area. The city was never approached on the development of this particular high school and especially the roads leading in and out of the high school and most importantly everything takes tax dollars, this project is estimated at \$2,300,000.00.

Mr. Tellez clarified the point of the relationship between the different governmental units in this county and the city. He stated that they did not become aware of the extent of the size of the high school until the land owners came in to subdivide the property and that's when they officially became aware of it. The U.I.S.D. position for the longest time has been that they are not subject to platting and building requirements. The city has had a tug of war with them to try to bring in the plans to see the magnitude of the project. He added that it is not that we do not want to cooperate with UISD, it's that we have not had full cooperation from the other governmental unit.

Mayor Ramirez stated that in 1992 the city did not have jurisdiction over the city limits except for the platting

and subdividing of the property. We did not even have the right-of-way to be able to start any design or any construction outside of our city limits, because we would be in absolute violation of the City Charter.

Mr. Ruben Correa, Area Manager for Central Power and Light, was present before the City Council to answer any questions. He summarized the fiber optic service program and the proposition plus the technical aspects of the tariffs proposed. He stated what CP&L is seeking is action to approve the proposed new experimental demand-side management tariffs. He explained that there are three tariffs proposed:

- (1) Experimental Time-of-Use Residential Tariff which is associated with the installation of the fiber optic line.
- (2) Experimental Thermal Storage service tariff which would be available to commercial and industrial customers that would qualify for service. This is a high technology

that would allow customers to use energy during off-peak hours.

(3) Experimental Demand Curtailment Rider which would be

available for the commercial and industrial customers The tariff would allow for interruption of service during peak conditions, the customers would have prior knowledge of the interruptions.

Mr. Correa stated that all the programs are in a voluntary basis.

Mr. Bill Morrow representing the central and southwest offices stated that what the fiber optic two-way communication allows them to do is to interactively communicate with their customers, and one of the communications would be to read the meters from the central office.

Mr. Jesus Ponce asked the City of Laredo to be informed and be given a detailed explanation as to what the ordinance in itself and the services that CPL is wanting to do on an experimental basis.

Mayor Ramirez stated that it is for exclusively new customers and is on a voluntary basis.

Mr. Correa stated that it does affect the customer and that it is an experimental residential rate and it is not necessarily for new residential customers. There are no fiber optic service customers at this time and this is strictly voluntary.

Dave Davis spoke in support of this technology that is emerging stating it is important since we are culture isolated.
