He added the amount of the fine is discretionary with the Municipal Judge, but that perhaps given the track record we might investigate the possibility of enjoining the business establishment or frankly shutting their business down if that's what it going to take to get their attention.

Cm. Cardenas stated that he would like to see this in black and white and that copies be sent to them.

Cm. Bruni stated that he had also received calls in this regard and asked that they get more strict with this violation.

Mr. Carlos Villarreal stated that possibly the next step would be to go to the District Court.

Jesus Ponce stated that somebody was posting notices with numbering the streets and asked if the city had anything to do with this.

Mr. Vargas stated that it might be a private company or group that uses stenciling the address on the curb as a fund raising technique.

Mr. Villarreal stated that they will follow-up on this issue because the curbs are city property and unless authorized by the city they are in violation of painting on the curbs.
