IX. COMMUNICATIONS

A. Request by Mr. Frank Sharp to address the City Council concerning low water pressure in North Laredo. (Sponsored by Councilmember Eduardo "Eddie" Perales)

Mr. Sharp stated that their area continues to have low water pressure and the residents are concerned as to what the city is doing to correct the situation.

Mayor Ramirez stated that council has taken a stand on improvements which have gone in and are continuing with an plan adopted in 1990.

Mr. Vargas answered the questions that Mr. Sharp had presented which were as follows:

1) What is the city prepared to do in case of a fire in any of these affected areas when the water is completely shut off? This is one of the biggest concerns of the residents for safety.

Mr. Vargas stated, "that when we did experience those problems the fire chief was notified by the utilities Director of the situation on that day, on a Tuesday. The fire chief immediately sent three 1,000 gallon tankers and stationed them at Del Mar Fire Station. It takes approximately 2,000 to 3,000 gallons to fight a normal fire. Water was available in the low lying areas that were within one-half mile from the highest points in Cross Country Subdivision. So we felt we had the adequate water in the area thru the use of these tankers in the event that there was a particular fire, when we experience the electrical malfunction at the pumping station."

Mr. Vargas stated that the important thing here was that there were provisions made for that eventuality.

He added another thing is that council has done in the past years is that they have passed more stringent building code requirements that require safer materials to be used.

2) Why do our areas, these affected areas, always loose water pressure and/or have a water failure whenever any type of failure occurs it seems like their area is the one that has the low pressure and the water completely shut-off.

Mr. Vargas answered, "Normally the areas that are situated on top of hills or on higher ground will suffer a loss of pressure first, because water flows downhill. The water was not shut-off, the three 1,000 gallon per minute pumps that were pumping could not meet the total peak demand.

Mr. Vargas stated that the electrical equipment was failing over a course of two or three days, we would fix the pumps assuming that the pumps were the problem, but it was actually the electrical panel. That's when we had to shut-down to replace that whole electrical system which has been on line for a couple of weeks now.

3) Why does the city not have backup provisions?

Mr. Vargas stated, "The city does have backup provisions.

We have three back pumps and motors at the Jefferson Water Treatment to insure the production of water and we also have two backup motors for the pumps at the boosters stations, but it takes four to six hours to replace each pump or motor."

He stated that the problem was with the electrical panel and not the pumps.

4) Since the city has an unlimited water supply, why can't the water storage facilities be kept full or nearly full?

Mr. Vargas stated that the storage tanks are filled and kept full approximately ten months of the year. When the temperature exceeds 100 degrees Fahrenheit for four days the demand of water increases two and one-half times, it is during this time that the system barely meets the demand or does not meet the demand when one or more pumps stop functioning. The city doesn't have an unlimited supply. It's not an infinite source. The Del Mar area or north east Laredo uses approximately three times more water than the average household in the city, therefore the peak demand is greater making it more difficult to keep the tanks full.

A 16 inch water line was installed from the Mines Road Booster Station to the 12 inch at International Blvd. Las Brisas along IH 35 south to Del Mar Blvd. and east on Del Mar Blvd. to Springfield at a cost of approximately \$670,000.

We are currently undergoing a plant expansion that will increase production at the Jefferson Water Plant from 38 to 55 million gallons per day. The first phase , 50%, will be completed by February 1994. The second phase will be completed in February, 1995 at a total cost of \$4,161,000. This project has already been approved and is being done.

Three five million gallon ground storage tanks with pumps are scheduled to be constructed in 1995, to serve the northeast, northwest and southern areas of the city. This will help considerable to meet peak demands in summer. (This cost, \$6,038,000.) We are proposing that construction on one of these five million gallon ground storage tanks be moved up to 1994 so it can service both the northeast and northwest part of Laredo this next summer at a cost of \$2,155,000.

A 16" water line on Del Mar Blvd., from Springfield to McPherson is scheduled to be constructed in 1995 at the cost of \$1,089,000. Also in 1995, a 36" water line from the Jefferson Water Plant to Mines Road and IH 35 is scheduled to be constructed at a cost of \$6,078,000.

5) Since there is such an obvious problem supplying water to the homes already in these areas, why are more building permits and constructions being allowed? What entity is responsible for the citing on this permits? All these homes in northern Shiloh, might not have any water.

Mr. Vargas answered that the City of Laredo has been a pro-active city in trying to facilitate the utilities for the growth that we have. The question of building or establishing a building moratorium we feel are a negative approach and we would rather work with a more pro-active approach to make sure the utilities are there.

He added that one of the things that we constantly work at, is that when a new development comes in that everyone is aware, and I am sorry that you happened to catch a supervisor who obviously was not aware, but this situation will be ratified.

He said that the building process goes thru a very public process, thru the Planning & Zoning Commission and thru the City Council as well, so that everyone is aware of what the requirements are for each particular subdivision.

Mr. Vargas added that he had eluded to the Winfield Estates. That particular facility is going to be provided water thru the east corridor, so it is not going to come from this particular system, it's going to come up from the east part of town.

- 6) How is the council going to answer the Texas Water Commission inquiries as to whether or not the state requirements of 35 pounds per square inch of pressure in all state municipalities, having to answer that this is not being met?
 - Mr. Vargas stated that the city is meeting that requirement 99.9% of the time. The problem is when there is mechanical or electrical failure, that they take consideration of that especially if they take mitigating steps such as we did with moving tankers into position.
- 7) If the situation continues, how can the city in good conscious promote itself as having adequate utilities?

Mr. Vargas responded that the City has a plan to correct these problems in our twenty year master plan. A 3,000 gallon per minute pump will be installed at the Mines Road booster station in approximately two weeks which will also assist in this particular problem.

The approach that we are taking is to begin at the treatment plant by enlarging that facility, it goes to the distribution system to the pipes that deliver the system as well as the pumping stations necessary and then the storage facility that will be on site to maintain additional storage.

8) Why is the new storage facility at McPherson and International Blvd not kept at maximum capacity?

Mr. Vargas stated that the same answer of question number four applies to this one. When the temperatures exceed 100 degrees Fahrenheit for more than four days or five days, the demand for water increases, it is during this time that the system barely meets the demand or does not meet the demand when one or more pumps stop functioning.

9) Why was the population of these areas not notified sooner thru the media of the seriousness of the problem and other areas of the city put on ration to help the affected areas, if this had anything to do with it?

Mr. Vargas answered that the utilities department personnel were responding to telephone calls throughout the night and day explaining the situation as best they could.

The Director visited KGNS-TV and the Laredo Morning Times giving them a press release indicating what the problem was and how we were trying to cope with it and asking people in fact to scale back their watering of lawns until we could catchup with the water in the tanks.

He concluded by stating that the reason that a rationing program was not implemented in all the City, was that the problem was in northeast part with other parts of the city not experiencing a problem with the water pressure.
