"The \$500,000.00 has been transferred from the general fund reserve account to the utility fund which in fact will go towards the funding that \$9 million is also in the agenda for this evening. Actually it's \$658,479.00 was a reserve for debt service in the event it becomes necessary."

Mayor Ramirez stated that the minutes have been prepared correctly, but that Mr. Vargas wanted clarification on that particular item.

Cw. Moreno asked if the \$500,000 come from this year's budget and if the \$680,000 come from last year's budget.

Mr. Vargas answered, yes, basically it's a carry over from one year to the next.

Mayor Ramirez stated that the minutes are correct as presented but that Mr. Vargas is telling us and recommending that they need to prepare a budget amendment for this year. He suggested that they present it as such with the proper transfers being made and council will consider it at such time.

Mr. Vargas clarify the budget amendment, "it would be that the \$658,479.00 would be reflected as a reserve for debt service for the general fund not for utilities."

Cm. Castaneda read a letter which he has addressed to the management staff of Continental Airlines in Houston. His letter stated how he had expressed dissatisfaction with the rudeness which was displayed by the employees of Continental at the Houston terminal and hopes that management will address this concern.

Cw. Aldridge also expressed concern over this matter in that she had received several complaints from city officials who had visited Laredo in the past few weeks and how they also received bad service and rudeness from the Continental employees at the Houston terminal.

XI. CITY COUNCIL DISCUSSION AND PRESENTATION

Requests by the Mayor and Councilmembers for discussion and presentation.

A. Request By Councilmember Felipe Cardenas

Cm. Juarez asked that staff report whenever the construction is completed.

2. Update on the status of the Roberto Llano running track.

Cm. Juarez asked that staff find out whether or not we do have the funds needed to have the double rails and possibly some type of lighting.

Carlos Villarreal, Assistant City Manager, stated that they have been discussing this item with Mrs. Collazo, Alfredo Castillo and Joe Guerra who has been in charge of the construction. Mr. Villarreal stated they are looking at an additional \$22,500.00, because they have already exhausted the amount of money that's available. He added that possibly they would like to do this as a complete package and hopefully bring back an amendment under CD budget to add the additional money approximately \$23,700. He continued by saying they are in the process of making other amendments which they would like to combine and possibly bring these amendments at the next council meeting.

C. Request By Councilmember Eduardo "Eddie" Perales

1. Discussion and possible action concerning the Town North Mobile Home Park.

Mr. Ron Whitehawk, representing Dr. Garcia the park developer, pointed out section 4 and 6 under Section (n) of the subdivision ordinance and stated that Dr. Garcia has complied with the required provisions and wanted a clarification. They wanted re-occupancy permits.

Marina Sukup, Planning Director, said that only permits of vacancies have been denied that are not under the above provisions and that some spaces do not comply with the ordinance provisions.

Dr. George Garcia, park owner, stated that he meets all the requirements in section 4, but wanted assistance in the underground wiring.

Mr. Tellez stated that there is a conflict with the way the ordinance was originally adopted and the way it was modified. Part of the problem is that when this ordinance was adopted Mr. Garcia should have been doing some things on a piece meal basis in order to conform with the ordinance. That's why most of the mobile home parks were given ten years to comply with the ordinance and then get the special use permit. At this point, his understanding of the problem that Mr. Garcia has, or some of the other mobile home park owners have, is the following:

a. They didn't comply with meeting the (a - i) of the ordinance in the last ten years and now because we won't issue a permit to allow somebody to re-occupy two spaces that he has available he's willing to conform to the ordinance the way it is.

Mayor Ramirez stated that we gave everybody a year to comply.

Marina Sukup, Planning Director, stated that in September the City Council passed an ordinance and at that time we allowed a number of things to happen without platting. We issued special permits for paving, we also allowed the re-occupying if anybody could prove that there had ever been a mobile home there before, we would allow them to re-occupy that up until August 1993 which was the effective date of the ordinance the unfortunate thing now is that in fact we have been issuing moving permits to these people the ordinances says if they comply, whether Dr. Garcia will comply or intends to comply, or may comply is not the issue. The

spaces that are supposedly unoccupied in his park now do not comply. There is no way that with doing some work he can make them comply nor can he make them comply while there is a mobile home sitting there and that this is his opportunity to in fact make them comply.

Mr. Vargas stated that they are willing to comply with all the requirements, except the electrical problem.

Mayor Ramirez asked who's responsibility is it for the care of premises when it relates to the mobile homes specifically. Is it Dr. Garcia or the owner of the mobile home.

Marina Sukup answered that the owner of the property is responsible for the quality of the mobile homes that go in there and insuring the tenants.

Rosie Campero, a resident of Town North, questioned the need for underground wiring and the necessity to temporarily move when improvements are made.

Elva Mitchell spoke for the residents of Town North in reference to problems with the Utilities Department. She spoke in reference to leaving Town North Mobile Park as it is.

Robin Lawrence resident of Town North voiced his concern in reference to underground cabling.

Mayor Ramirez stated that this item is not a public hearing and was brought up for discussion and the situation is presently under consideration by the Planning & Zoning Commission.

NOTE: Cw. Moreno returned to the council meeting at this time: 7:40 p.m.

D. Request By Councilmember Arlene Rash Aldridge

Cw. Aldridge requested that Larry Dovalina look into the contract that Paragon Cable Company has to provide/carry local news.

Larry Dovalina and Hilario Cavazos, Laredo Cable Commission Chairman, gave the council a brief synopsis of what the Cable Consumer Protection Act of 1992 basically does for the city.

(No report was turned in to the City Secretary).

Larry Dovalina stated that what it has done is that it has given the opportunity to the franchising authorities of which the City of Laredo is one, to regulate the basic rates which is one of the main features of the Act. Among other things within the Act is the issue of re-transmission consent which is the issue Cw. Aldridge

has eluded too which is the issue that is most prominent taking place within the community.

Carlos Del Castillo, local Paragon Cable Manager, stated that they "must carry option" is no longer in the act, that now a "re-transmission consent option" is in effect that was elected by KGNS and KVTV. Telemundo having elected a "must carry option" and are now in the line-up. This now places Paragon to recompensate the local stations and had to negotiate by October 6th and did not receive consent by either KVTV and KGNS. They are now close to finalizing an agreement with KGNS and KVTV and permanent action will be provided to the consumer by Wednesday and they will finalize their plans.

Deborah Murphy, KVTV Manager, stated that they are continuing negotiations and will resolve the problem with Paragon within the next couple of days.

Jeff Pryor, Vice-President of KGNS, stated that they negotiating and are close to reaching an agreement with Paragon by Wednesday.

Larry Dovalina stated that "no", local news are not included or required to be carried by Paragon. The fact that the law itself includes a re-transmission consent that deals specifically with the issue of local broadcasters coming on to the cable or being carried on to the cable would specifically be excluded because it's being superseded by the federal law.
