Cm. Juarez asked for a report from staff as to how they plan to utilize that particular space.

City Manager, Peter H. Vargas stated that it's being developed right now. They might have it ready by the end of this week.

Cm. Juarez asked if they had looked into the traffic department, especially the one that services the meters in the downtown area, the ones that are moving back and forth to the airport and losing time. He added they could be there and perform their work from that place and eliminate the trips back and forth. Cm. Juarez asked that they also consider and explore to see if the present court room would better meet the needs of our Municipal Court Judge instead of refurnishing it for another purpose.

- D. Requests from Councilmember Cecilia Moreno:
 - Report regarding the status of the mobile home ordinance.

Cw. Moreno stated that they have not heard from P&Z regarding the mobile home ordinance.

City Manager, Peter H. Vargas, stated that the direction from the council was to conduct a study group with representatives that were at the Council to discuss the amendment that was presented to the council. He added that they are in the process of doing that and reviewing the ordinance as it was presented to the individuals. Mr. Vargas stated they had discovered that there was confusion as to what was actually included in the ordinance and what was not. At that time several individuals told council they were not interested in any restrictions in regards to the use of mobile homes.

Mr. Vargas stated that since then another item has come up. He added that in 1984 there was a clause or amendment to the ordinance that required that as of Sept. 2, 1988 any mobile home that was withdrawn could not be replaced unless that property meet the zoning ordinance requirements which is basically B-3 zone district and the setback requirements. He

added what has happen is that there has been much confusion, in particular on the part of property owners who were unaware of that particular amendment that had been passed some time ago.

Mr. Vargas stated that due to the confusion he was recommending to council that possibly amending the clause so that it runs concurrent with the ordinance, which is that by 1993 all mobile home must comply with the zoning regulation for their use.

Mr. Vargas stated they will also hold a workshop on what's currently pending and that no action has been taken by the commission until now.

Cw. Moreno wanted to know when action is being taken on this item.

Mr. Vargas stated that it might come back to council within a month. (Last meeting in July for Zoning Dept.)

2. Discussion and possible action regarding the consideration for each district having an alternate Planning and Zoning Commission member.

Cw. Moreno stated that a problem that exists is that sometimes the members do not attend the meetings, there is no quorum and there is no meeting. She added if we had an alternate he/she could attend the meetings.

Cw. Moreno asked if it is possible to have an alternate or what are the regulations.

Peter Vargas, City Manager stated that alternates are not possible because of state law regulations and also because the individuals that are nominated receive a lot of data information.

Jerry B. Cain, Assistant City Attorney, stated that he did not have an answer to Cw. Moreno's question at this time. He added that he didn't know of any provision in the law for alternates.

Mayor stated that we do have a policy that we have established that if they don't go to certain number of meetings that they are automatically disqualified from the P&Z Commission. He stated that we might not be enforcing this.

Mr. Vargas stated that the rules and procedure states that after three consecutive absences that they are removed.

Mayor suggested that we go in there and state if they miss more than $\odot x$ amount of the total regular meetings that they have during the 12 month period that they will be automatically disqualified. It's either three consecutive or 50% of the total meetings that are held and send the attendance to Council on a quarterly basis.

Cw. Aldridge recommended that all the appointees on the commission go on training on policies and procedures before they start serving on the commission.

Motion to have a recommendation from staff regarding on the percentage of meetings that all commission members must attend during the 12 month period. Cw. Moreno stated it should be on a percentage because it's not a matter of consecutive, (in consecutive you are absent two meetings and present one) also making it mandatory and automatic disqualification.

Peter Vargas, City Manager, stated that in order to implement the new pay plan we made the change at one point for the whole fiscal year as of October and the qualifications then for an individual to move up is that for the year of implementation we were not going to move anyone thru steps or grades. That everyone moved in to the new pay plan. He added that the majority of the employees got pay increases in order to get into it, a classification and a paying grade consistent with the new plan. This was for 1991/92.

Mr. Vargas continued saying that for 1992/93 fiscal year the individual will have to be evaluated and receive a good evaluation in order to proceed towards the next step, which is a 5% salary adjustment.

Cw. Moreno asked if this was only one evaluation that the employee needs or more than one.

Mr. Vargas stated only one evaluation is needed, basically on the anniversary date. (Date they were hired)

Cw. Moreno had a question on the anniversary date, stating that she assumed that when you go into a new pay plan everybody's anniversary date (if they had already been working with the city) should be when the pay plan came into effect not when they were hired.

Cw. Moreno clarified when the plan came into effect that's their anniversary not when they were hired.

Mr. Vargas clarified that in this instance, because it was a radical change from a total new program, that in order to get in step with that program we indicated that everyone would come in and for that year there would be no step increases and the next year the most logical and equitable is on an anniversary date.

Cw. Moreno stated that she does not think this is correct in the interpretation that was given to what is being implemented.

Mayor clarified "perceive that the action taken is being implemented."

Mr. Vargas stated that if we do what Cw. Moreno is suggesting everyone gets a pay increase on October 1st and it's going to cost.

Cw. Moreno stated, "We knew that, that's why they didn't get one last year."

Mr. Vargas stated it was also presented to the Council that it was going to be based on evaluations and those evaluations could not be done all at one time.

Cw. Moreno replied, "yes we had the whole year to evaluate everyone."

Mr. Vargas stated you cannot give an increase on an evaluation that was done six months ago, it has to be a current evaluation. He added that everyone understood that for the first year of the implementation of the pay period that there would be no adjustments and yet people were being evaluated, but there would be no pay adjustment given to those evaluations. Mr. Vargas stated what we were saying here is, "that given the first of the implementation year, the second year then we would come in step with anniversary dates for evaluations."

Cw. Moreno asked about the employees that have been working for two years others for ten or 15 years and were all in the same pay grade because it was the same category.

Mr. Vargas stated that what he was suggesting is that you have to have a system that's in place, that is equitable and that can't be individual specific it has to have classification specific in order to be equitable in the long term and granted that there might be a situation for small group of individuals maybe caught in that situation.

Cw. Moreno made a motion that staff find out how many people are going to get caught in it and to see the effect that it's going to have. She added this is not what she had intended for the program.

Moved: Cw. Moreno Second: Cm. Perez

Against: 0 Abstain: For: 8

Cw. Moreno again clarified, "Anniversary date is important if you are a new employee, but if you have been employed for ten years, anniversary date is when the pay plan came into effect. Who remembers if you were hired in September or December, that is 10 or 15 years ago, what's important is that under this new pay plan, these are the rules now and all those people should have their anniversary date in October now.

Mr. Crafton stated that anniversary date is a moving target when you get hired at one time, but when you get promoted from one pay grade to another, then the anniversary date changes and it's now your promotion date.

Cw. Moreno stated when you take groups and put them together people are back to anniversary date. "Anniversary date" has no significance when you group people that have two and five years experience together.

Cw. Moreno again asked that staff get a report to the effect that this will have, how many people are being affected and the financial effect. Also, what is the difference in terms of cost. That staff bring us back a report on what will it cost to have the salary increases, have the year be October 1st and have the increase come in with the pay plan for those people who are already working and have at least ©x number of years and going in the anniversary. What would be the difference as per

October 1st then waiting for the anniversary.

- E. Request from Councilmember Eduardo Perales:
 - 1. Discussion and possible action regarding the promotional funds of the City of Laredo.

Cm. Perales suggested that a meeting be set and posted formally for next week regarding this item.

Cm. Perales suggested Monday at 4:00 P.M. (June 22, 1992)

2. Discussion and possible action regarding the uniforms worn by the Police Officers.

Cm. Perales stated that some officers have complained to him about the hats (vinyl type). He stated that they had complained that they are very hot in this weather which makes them uncomfortable and that they have been using them for many years.

Chief of Police, J.L. Martinez, stated that he agrees to what was said and that they are working in getting new ones. They had already spoken to the uniform company about this.

3. Discussion and possible action regarding land usage North of the Airport to Del Mar Boulevard.

Cm. Perales stated there were some questions and since this item is coming back on Monday's meeting he stated he would like staff to meet with landowners in this particular area to outline some of the problems before we bring this item before council.

Mr. J.C. Trevino representing Jacaman Cattle Company who is one of the owners immediately north of the airport stated that P&Z had turned down the request to be zoned as an agricultural area. Mr. Trevino stated that one of the primary reasons might have been that it's not within the master plan. stated the way it was published was to zone the 1,500 acres as agricultural permanently, which was a big opposition on their part. He added that Council might direct staff to work out an agreement with the landowners and work something out within the plan and see if we can bring a recommendation to P&Z and then to Council as a development for this entire 1,500 acres which would then be compatible with the growth and development of the airport, the inner loop, Casa Verde Road and Del Mar so that everything

is brought together one time rather than having to zone 1,500 acres and having us come back a number of times for zone changes.

Cm. Juarez clarified this is District II.

Carlos Villarreal, Assistant City Manager, stated that some control or compromise should be made with the people so that people acknowledge that the airport will have noise, and thru a noise study hopefully we can accomplish something and later on they won't expect and indicate to the city that they want to move the airport.

Cm. Perales recommended that they continue to use the comprehensive plan and to use M-1 because it's a good tax base, if they build there it would be compatible to the airport and it's a major development.

Motion was made to send it back to P&Z and study the issue, so that they can include not only Cm. Perales but also the Councilmember of the district.

Mayor Saul N. Ramirez clarified, "include the recommendation to look at the master plan and what Cm. Perales was saying."

Moved: Cm. Juarez Second: Cm. Moreno

Cm. Perales apologized for unintentionally getting into Cm. Juarez's district.

4. Discussion and possible action regarding health concerns.

Cm. Perales was concerned about health and asked that maybe some kind of campaign be made to immunize children thru the schools.

Jerry Robinson, Health Department Director, stated there is an active campaign going on all the time thru the Health Department. He added there is a small amount of immunizations done in the private sector in physician's offices. Mr. Robinson stated the problem is timeliness of the immunizations, it's very difficult to get the children immunize exactly on time when they should be immunized. He added this would require a campaign such as the one being requested. He stated the Health Department would be more than happy to work with all school nurses that are interested in trying to get this

campaign going actively and all the citizen's best interest to get these children immunize timely.

Mr. Robinson stated by immunizing timely we will reduce the potential risk on various epidemics that could occur. He specified that immunization should be given at certain age groups:

- 2 months of age DPT
- 4 months of age Oral Polio Vaccination

He stressed that the problem is getting the children between the ages of four months and approximately three years of age.

Cm. Perez suggested a satellite clinic to those that are unable to come to the central clinic. He added that maybe there is a possibility of having a health mobile if we cannot afford a place to vaccinate these children.

Mayor Saul N. Ramirez, Jr. also suggested that maybe they can work with Vital Statistics to monitor the kids that are born in our community that are in the records with local addresses so that we can target them with some sort of correspondence in Spanish and English suggesting things like this vaccination mobile clinic to compliment the campaign there.

Mr. Robinson stated that we are not doing this here and added that it is an excellent idea. He added this is a matter of funding and staffing capacity however, he stated they are moving in the those directions.

Mayor Saul N. Ramirez, Jr. stated that our City Secretary is very capable in drawing out information from the data base that he has created and that costliness of the project is money well spent in participating in a campaign such as this.

Cm. Castaneda stated that another recommendation area would be in the area of the health education centers initiative for South Texas that we have started working on. He stated the is another area because it really brings all the health professionals and agencies together that whenever we need to make a campaign like the one Cm. Perales is talking about it's very easy because you already have the group of people solidified.

Cm. Perales asked that they take this under advise and then come back to Council and report on the action that was taken.

5. Discussion and possible action regarding the access roads for Interstate Highway 35.

Cm. Perales stated this concern was brought by Del Mar residents that when they get off the expressway they feel that they need a yield sign there. They have a problem with the changing of lanes.

Cm. Perales wanted the Traffic Department to meet with the Texas Dept. of Transportation to see what can be done.

Amadeo Saenz, Engineer for Texas Department of Transportation, explained that the question about the yield signs at the exit ramps, these signs are regulatory signs that say DO NOT CROSS DOUBLE WHITE LINES that signals the people that are exiting IH 35 to a designated lane and they have that lane opened all the way to the intersection. Once he gets into that frontage road he is in normal fragile traffic and he can only move to the right when it's safe to do so and that it's a state law and the reason why this yield signs are not up there.

Mr. Saenz continued saying with Yield Signs you get people stopping and it will create a number of accidents with rear end collisions.

Cm. Perales stated he would like that the Traffic Department make some kind of an announcement on the Public Access so that people understand why the state is doing this because people are confused why other cities do have yield signs. So that they understand that it's for the safety of the motorist.

Mr. Saenz stated they will be working with the Police Department and with Public Access in putting some kind of announcement.

Cw. Aldridge stated that when we have the piled up traffic backed up on the expressway and people come over the hill, all of a sudden, they have to put on the brakes because they are almost running into someone else in front of them.

Cw. Aldridge asked what can be done to let people know that they have to slow down because of the expressway traffic flow situations or problems.

Mr. Saenz answered that the department is in the process of updating a project development plan because of the new federal authorization bill and there are many different categories that are covered

in the federal bill of which some have to do with traffic safety. He continued saying that in regards to this to point they have requested as part of the PDP to put some advance warning signs that will take care of that.

Mr. Saenz stated that as soon as PDP approves a changeable message signs they will take care of this situation.

Mr. Luis Ramirez, Associate District Engineer, was introduced by Mr. Saenz which made a presentation on the action plan of what is going to take to open a district office in Laredo.

At this time Mr. Saenz gave a status report of their reconstruction projects and estimated time of completion on McPherson; Zacate Creek Bridge; the divided section of the Mines Road from Colombia Bridge to FM 255 four miles towards Laredo and the Inner Loop Project which will take approximately 12 months to complete.

F. Request from Councilmember Jerry Perez:

Discussion and possible action regarding the status of the Anna Truck Route Project.

Amador Escudero, Engineer made the presentation and gave a status report of this project.

He stated completion of this project is approximately by August 1, 1992 and the cost of the project was \$1,890,000. 00 of which EDA has participated with \$696,000.00

Mayor Pro-Tem, Blas Castaneda, took over the meeting while Mayor Ramirez stepped out momentarily.

Mr. Bill Sawyer a resident from Del Mar spoke in favor of removing the medians.

Mr. Jorge Anders a resident from Del Mar stated that the medians eliminate traffic that is going fast. He stated if the medians are eliminated more traffic accidents will occur. Mr. Anders thought that elimination is not the point and that council should also consider this.

Ms. Rebecca Martinez resident of the Park Place Condominiums was concerned about the medians because she has a hard time getting in and has to get on top of the curb. She stated that she didn't know if eliminating the median would help or maybe cutting them shorter.

Mr. Randy Blair resident of Del Mar Blvd. was concerned with traffic problems if more lanes are made in the current lanes. He added that more lanes would be dangerous in that area. Mr. Blair spoke in favor of possibly replacing the medians with shorter medians allowing the people of different projects, apartments and condominiums to be able to get in and out.

Ms. Connie Hughes resident of Park Place Condos was concerned and stated it's a detriment to all the residents there. She added they have to go against traffic regulations in order to get into he north side of the median because cars are unable to turn and as a result they contradict each other. Ms. Hughes added this is a very dangerous situation and she wishes that medians be removed.

Mr. Vargas stated that they will look into the signage situation and that he agrees that there should be some signage indicating that there is a reduction in lanes. He added given direction by council, we can proceed then to study the possibility of putting the turning lanes or putting in smaller medians that will not require landscaping but would be for traffic circulation purposes.

Cm. Perales stated that traffic violations are a problem in that area and that police will be issuing citations in that area.

Chief of Police, J.L. Martinez, stated they have been issuing citations in that area and have had numerous positive calls from residents of Del Mar.
