

Woodmen of the World

The Woodmen of the World is a fraternal organization founded in Omaha, Nebraska, on June 6, 1890, which provides life and burial insurance for their members. Today, the Society's 850,000 members belong to nearly 3,000 lodges and hold more than one million certificates. The mission of the Woodmen of the World is "to help ensure financial security for our members by providing quality products and exceptional service; to foster fraternalism through family, civic, charitable and patriotic activities; to achieve these results through superior teamwork and dedicated leadership; and to be mindful that we exist for the benefit of our members." Their national headquarters is in Omaha, Nebraska. Many beautiful monuments are located in the section conveyed to Woodmen of the World, Camp Ahuehuetec No. 2364, on June 4, 1909. The Ahuehuetec lodge today is located at 5409 Springfield Avenue. Nearby is the Woodmen of the World Camp Robles section in which there are approximately 20 graves that date 1926-1974. The Robles camp dissolved on February 1, 1965. A third Woodmen of the World section is located northwest of the cemetery office.
