Mr. Sandy Gibson, President of the Firefighters Association, stated that they are past the expiration date of 60 days of negotiating and have not reached an agreement. He further stated that at the last meeting with the City Manager, both parties agreed to most of the contract with the exception of an item requesting to give up the upper level rank of District Chiefs.

City Manager Peter H. Vargas explained that staff made a survey of cities in Texas with similar concerns. The results of that survey revealed that a pay increase would be appropriate for the firefighters. In attempting to improve the contract, the City Manager felt the need to separate management from staff positions.

The department has a total of 170 firefighters with 11 of which are upper management.

District Chief Mike Sauceda stated that problems will arise if they are separated from staff positions.

City Manager Vargas clarified that the only change he is recommending is that the District Captains not be represented for pay benefits by the Union, but rather that it be management's responsibility to maintain an equitable pay plan for people in the management group. There will be no changes in their job duties, responsibilities or pay benefits.

The City Manager will submit his recommendations to City Council at a later date.

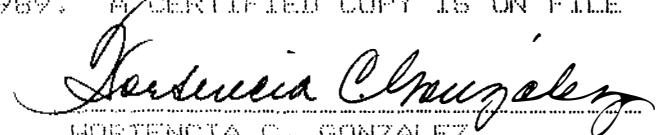
