I. MAYOR TO CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER.

Due to the Mayor's slight delay, and with a quorum present, Mayor Pro-Tem David R. Cortez called the meeting to order.

II. PUBLIC HEARING

A. Consideration of the annexation of the North-Mines Road area, consisting of approximately 2,300 acres. The area is generally located West of Interstate 35, South of a line extended along the North boundary of Tejas Industrial Park to Mines Road, the North to a line extended from the North boundary of the Hornberger property, then West to river. The following subdivisions are included: Rancho Viejo, Lowry Farms, Dellwood Estates Sections I and III, Tejas Industrial Park I, II and III and RMR Industrial Park. There are approximately 522 dwelling units and a population of 1,800. This is one of four scheduled public hearings.

The public hearing was opened and after the City Manager explained the service plan, the public in attendance was asked to speak to the issue of proposed annexation of the area.

The following area residents spoke against the annex-

ation citing such major concerns as economics as well as police protection and other delivery of services.

Eliseo Perez, Marco Villarreal, Homero Ochoa and Ana Garcia, Gilbert Sanchez, Robert Gonzalez, Joe Soliz, Jesus Leal, Adan Castillo, Peter Alvarez, Maria Teresa Casiano, Jim Williams, and Dr. Vera.

IIA. Contract be awarded to the low bidder, Ochoa Company for replacing the air conditioner chiller and compressor of the Police Department building for \$29,403.00. Two bids were received, with the other bid being \$29,489.00. Zuniga Engineering Company provided plans and specifications and will inspect installation and acceptance of work at 6% of the total cost or \$1,764.18. Work is to be completed within 14 days.

This item was not addressed due to lack of quorum.

III. ADJOURNMENT

After discussions ceased, meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
