Driving without financial responsibility (No Insurance)	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Present valid insurance card/policy which was in effect prior to and on the date of the offense 2. Defendant must have a valid drivers license	No	None
Expired drivers license	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Present a valid drivers license	Yes	\$20
Expired motor vehicle registration	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Present proof of motor vehicle registration for the vehicle listed on the citation	Yes	\$20
Operating a vehicle without valid registration insignia properly displayed	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Present proof vehicle listed on citation was issued a registration insignia before the offense was committed 2. Present proof insignia is properly displayed	No	\$10
Operating a vehicle without complying with inspection requirements	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Present proof of motor vehicle inspection for the vehicle listed on the citation	Yes	\$20
Failure to report change of address or name on drivers license	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Present proof the address or name has been changed with the Tx. Dept of Public Safety (DPS)	Yes	\$20
Operate vehicle with defective required equipment* (or in unsafe condition)	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Defendant must remedy the defect 2. Does not apply if the offense involves a commercial motor vehicle	No	\$10
Operate a vehicle without two valid license plates	Before or on your court appearance date	1. Defendant must remedy the defect	No	\$10

Listed violations can be processed for compliance dismissal by Court Staff. Some violations are eligible for a dismissal request through the online services.

All other requests for compliance dismissals (defective equipment, violate driver license restriction, etc), defendant must appear before the Judge to present proof violation has been corrected.

Most common defective equipment violations:

- head lamps (lights)
- tail lamps (lights)
- stop lamp (lights)
- license plate lamp (light)
- turn signals
- parking lamps (lights)
