

#### Message from the Chief

"Success is not measured by the number of arrests, but by the absence of crime"-Sir Robert Peel. The forefather of the modern policing model, Sir Robert Peel, said it best. The absence of crime is the best measure of success for any police organization. The men and women of your Laredo Police Department have yet again mitigated the crime rates and we can reassuringly state that Laredo is a safe community. As always, combating the perception of crime increasing in our border community is much different as what the actual F.B.I. Uniform Crime Report statistics represent. The continued reduction of crime is a message that each of us must convey to our families and friends so that we all become ambassadors for the City of Laredo proportioning both pragmatic and verified information about our city's safety.

In my daily outings in my LPD uniform or when I am out with my family I am often reminded of the tremendous work our officers are doing on the front lines during their patrol shifts. The outbreak of anti-police sentiment throughout our nation is deafened here locally by the daily compliments and laudatory remarks for the humble acts of heroism and human compassion our officers render throughout their shifts on patrol. We have joined many

other Police Departments in mourning the loss of their officers in the line of duty and our Laredo community mourns along with us. As a Chief I couldn't ask for better officers but I also expect nothing less than outstanding work by everyone wearing an LPD shield.

The Laredo Police Department has continued to enhance its modern abilities to combat crime. The purchase of a new unmanned aerial vehicle has enabled us with a new advantage over



crime by granting us air superiority. We have invested and adequately trained officers to give us an enhanced capability not only on major applications but also support timely images of traffic congestion and accident reconstruction investigations. The air unit also allows the Police Department to search large areas in an expeditious manner. An important tool since the city is surrounded by a substantially large brush country and unpopulated areas. The air unit would save precious time and man power if anyone ever

went missing or if a person of special needs or a senior citizen needs to be immediately located and given medical attention. The training along with the structure and rules designed to ensure the





privacy of our citizens make this new aerial unit an indispensable tool for the Laredo Police Department.

The Laredo Police Department has also adopted new 3-D computer reanimation software and equipment to be able to take the various complexities of a case, whether a major vehicle accident or a murder case, and be able to display the actions and recreate the incident using computer animation graphics. The equipment is state of the art and has already proven successful in major cases in court. The continued enhancement of innovative technology in the Laredo Police Department will further our abilities to keep the community safe and make the Department efficient.

My administration and many officers of the Police Department have examined other best practices in policing allowing us to stay viable in an ever changing world. The biggest challenge has been reevaluating old Police approaches and arriving at better solutions. The implementation of the new compressed work week in where our officers are working 10 hour shifts instead of the traditional 8 hours shift is just such one of the newest approaches. The beta testing is on ongoing process but the enhancement is undeniable. The change allows officers to have 3 days off to be with their families but has also restructured a better way to serve our city. The intent is to develop a stronger unity of command, build stronger teams on patrol, render better patrol service by overlapping of units to better serve the public's growing needs, spend less on overtime due to the overlapping shift structure, and make a better quality of life for our officers. At present the new structure is functioning better than expected and is rendering positive results.

Once again I have decided to save the best news for last. The Laredo Police Department has for a 7<sup>th</sup> consecutive year reduced crime in our city. This report, which is locally compiled, and includes part of the F.B.I.'s annual uniform crime report, will illustrate per category of crime, how successful and how safe the community of Laredo, Texas is. I have included the following chart to condense all of this important information as quick reference information to present the last 7 years of crime in our community.

- 1,731 fewer violent offenses and 5,953 fewer property crimes = **7,684** offenses that did not take place in 2015 compared to 2009 with an **overall** reduction of 34.6%.

Finally I thank you, our Laredo citizens, for your continued support and feedback so that we may always be able to come together as one community and Police Department and find solutions to our challenges and work together for the future of our city.



The Narcotics and Vice section directly operates the surveillance, arrest and seizure of "street level narcotics" and its participants. The section also is responsible for "vice crime" such as prostitution, promotion of prostitution and the gathering of intelligence for the purposes of advancing narcotics investigations through the development of confidential informants and undercover work. This investigative section works closely alongside other LPD divisions and also partners alongside other law enforcement agencies in order to more effectively combat criminal elements in the Laredo Community.

The patrol division exists to "protect and serve". The primary mission of the patrol division is public safety and crime deterrence of assigned beats within certain geographic locations and adjacent areas. The patrol division officers are generally first on the scene for most emergency calls and undergo continuous advanced training in order to enhance and improve first response services for the Laredo Community.

POPS is a policing strategy that involves the identification and analysis of specific crimes and disorder problems, in order to develop effective response strategies in conjunction with ongoing assessments. The goals of Problem Oriented Policing Strategy include increasing lines of communication with the public in order to assess priorities within a certain area of the community and develop more proactive versus reactive police practices. The activity of the group has drastically increased arrests of repeat offenders and has led to the recovery of stolen property. The unit conducted bike and foot patrols in problem areas with high crimes especially in those neighborhoods with high incidents of burglaries and thefts. The unit was also used to address traffic congestion issues and effectively increase patrol presence. The effectiveness of this program has become a pivotal instrument of enforcement in identified hot spots that significantly affects crime rates in a positive way.





#### **Traffic Enforcement**

Laredo Police Officers assigned to this unit, in addition to enforcing all criminal laws, concentrate daily on enforcement of traffic laws. Their duties also include accident reports and Commercial Motor Vehicle traffic enforcement. The traffic section, primarily address traffic enforcement and accident investigations, have acquired state of the art equipment to help reconstruct how an accident occurred. The Traffic Officers are constantly enhancing their skills with up to date training and modern accident reconstruction techniques.

#### U.S. Marshals Fugitive Apprehension Task Force

Both the warrants task force section and the patrol division collaborate with the U.S. Marshals Fugitive Apprehension Task Force. The United States Marshals Service currently leads 85 localized fugitive task forces. The majority of the task forces are full-time efforts; however, additional task forces are formed on an ad-hoc basis, in response to specific cases. Funding for these task forces is often granted through initiatives such as the High Density Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA), Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDETF), and Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN). The arrests made are that of fugitive criminals that pose a significant threat to the safety of the Laredo citizenry.








#### **Emergency Dispatch**

#### Alcohol Tobacco Firearms Task Force

The Laredo Police Department undertook a new initiative in 2011 that carried over its impact through 2012. The initiative involved partnering with a Federal Agency, the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and Explosives (ATF). This endeavor evolved into the creation of a task force that partnered the Laredo area ATF and four members of the Laredo PD Bomb Squad. The initiative involved each agency supporting the other in incidents and investigations involving explosives. Furthermore, the task force conducted proactive as well as follow-up investigations involving weapon violations; especially those cases with ties to prison gangs, felons or Mexican drug cartels. One of the partnership's strengths is its flexibility to leverage state and/or federal resources and prosecutions.





#### ATF CONTINUED...

The initiative has proven productive through prosecutions and convictions that make an impact on the local crime scene. The task force handles those cases that involve weapons, are high profile, involve felons, involve violence and involve prison gangs. Below is a summary of the cases handled by the ATF task force:

The positive impact is derived from the conviction and therefore reduction of the number of repeat offenders in our community who have historically shown a propensity for committing crimes through violence and use of deadly weapons.
