Message from Chief Claudio Treviño, Jr.



Representing this city's Police force includes getting asked one particular question many times over. The question is often, "is your city safe?" This 2018 annual report emphatically answers that question with a firm "Yes we are safe!" The city has significant double digit reductions in crime over the last ten years, which is a feat not easily accomplished, no matter how big or small your community is. As your Police Department, we have stressed the need to come together as one community and have extensive lines of communication, transparency and trust in order to continue enjoying the quality of safety we have presently. SecurityChoice.com ranked Laredo, Texas No. 3 of the Top 20 "U.S. Comeback Cities," in its latest study. The data for the study was gathered from the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting

Program. In addition, Laredo was also named #1 in Texas with its crime reduction of -2.8%. The website gathered data between 2006 and 2016 and found the total number of violent and property crimes dropped from 6,164 per 100,000 people to 3,364, according to the study.

As the Chief of the Laredo Police Department, my job is tasked with coming up with new innovations that will ensure the city's safety for generations to come and equip, train and prepare our officers for the challenges that await our near future. With the full support of the Laredo Mayor, City Council and City Management we will very soon introduce our newly added Real Time Crime Center (RTCC) to our arsenal of crime fighting tools. The Real Time Crime Center will act as a 24/7 command center for citywide cameras, license plate readers, and associated technology that can be leveraged by public safety at the local, state and federal levels.

In addition to the RTCC we have also initiated new implementations to the recreation of crime scenes and accident reconstruction with the use of a 3D-Technology named FARO. FARO Technologies is a 3D-Imaging, measurement and realization technology which will enable faster, more accurate, compelling and usable 3D documentation. FARO records millions of measurements in seconds, within +- 1mm of accuracy which can be verified in court and even take a jury virtually through the digital 3D scene to see exactly how it looked at the time of the incident placing them at the scene.





The Identification section has recently acquired a National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN) system from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) to help identify ballistic evidence from crime scenes and recovered bullet casings. When a gun is made, the manufacturing equipment etches microscopic markings — somewhat like fingerprints — onto the gun's metal parts. These markings, called tool marks, are transferred to a bullet or cartridge casings when the gun is fired. When law enforcement investigates crimes in which firearms are used, ballistic imaging of such bullets and cartridge cases can be important in solving crimes.

The Laredo Police Department has signed an agreement with the Texas A&M International University to get better feedback from our citizens about issues they may have in their neighborhoods, or if they would like to suggest new strategies in addressing any concerns. The new agreement, the first of its kind between TAMIU and LPD, provides a framework for TAMIU's faculty researchers to work with LPD to access crime statistics and crime-related data needed to pursue research on the effectiveness, efficiency, and equity in law enforcement and governance while extending our knowledge and understanding of how we can work together in partnership to promote police-community relations.

This report and the reductions within are a direct result of the work and tireless dedication of the men and women of our entire Police Department. This endeavor of maintaining our safety is no singular feat. Our continued successes with joint efforts alongside various other law enforcement agencies at the Federal, State and Local levels remain of paramount importance for the continued safety and security of our border city. The shared wealth of criminal intelligence and continued partnerships, through joint task forces and various collaborations, ensure that Laredo remains a safe city to raise a family and set the ideal environment for our city's prosperity for generations to come.

Our officers remain committed to protect and serve while always remaining approachable, compassionate and humble.

The Narcotics and Vice section directly operates investigations of "street level narcotics" and its participants. The section also is responsible for "vice crime" such as prostitution, promotion of prostitution and the gathering of intelligence for the purposes of advancing narcotics investigations through the development of confidential informants and undercover work. Additionally the Unit also enforces illegal gambling cases & Alcohol related businesses.
