CITY OF LAREDO ORDINANCE NO. 2005-O-228

AMENDING CHAPTER 7, BUILDING AND BUILDING REGULATIONS, SECTION 7-2. SAME-AMENDMENTS, SECTION 108.3 BUILDING PERMIT VALUATIONS, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY DELETING EXISTING MECHANISMS FOR ESTABLISHING VALUATIONS AND CREATING SPECIFIC VALUTAIONS FOR THE DETERMINATION OF PERMIT FEES; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Laredo has adopted building codes and has ordained the issuance of building permits and inspections for enforcement of said codes for the purposes of Health, Safety, and General Welfare of the citizens of Laredo; and,

WHEREAS, a fee structure has been established for the purposes of issuing building permits and a periodic review of said permits is consistent with the City of Laredo's desire to provide this service; and,

WHEREAS, said fee structure is based on the valuation of the proposed construction; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on September 6, 2005, and finds the establishment of valuations appropriate and consistent with the General Plan of the City of Laredo; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAREDO THAT:

Section 1: Chapter 7, Buildings and Building Regulations, Section 7-2. Same-Amendments, Section 108.3, Building Permit Valuations, of the City of Laredo Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 108.3 Building permit valuations. Building valuations shall be based on the latest building valuation data as published by the International Code Council.

Initiated by: Staff source: City Manager Keith Selman, Planning and Zoning Director Cynthia Collazo, Deputy City Manager Prior action: This item was introduced by Gene Belmares at the City Council meeting of 09/06/05. On 08/20/01 the City Council adopted the existing ordinance and the valuations established by the International Code Council were input at that time. At the budget workshop of 08/10/05 the City Council directed staff to increase those valuations 20% for the purposes of determining constructions fees. **BACKGROUND** For the Health, Safety, and General welfare of the citizens of Laredo, the City Council has adopted building codes. To ensure implementation of these codes, City Council has further ordained the issuance of building permits and inspections. During the course of time, a periodic review of the fees for the issuance of the permits is undertaken. After a brief presentation to City Council at the budget workshop, City Council determined an increase in valuations and hence fees, is appropriate at this time. The net effect of this increase is 20%. FINANCIAL IMPACT: STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff supports the proposed amendment.

The proposed amendment will increase revenues

approximately \$295,000 over the next fiscal year.
