Progress Report to mayor and City Council on the City-County Blue Ribbon Committee on Health Issues:

On January 9, 2007 Mayor Raul G. Salinas held a "Swearing in Ceremony" for the BRC on Health Issues.

The committee has met since then and discussed its mission and charge; the following is a summary of the committee activities to date:

- 1. Formulated Mission Statement after charge was made clear by Mayor Salinas: May 2007.
- 2. Mission Statement: As concerned health leaders, the Blue Ribbon Committee on health issues is committed to promoting the health and safety of Laredo by identifying existing and emerging health and healthcare issues and will recommend specific actions to the Mayor and City Council.
- 3. Presented a resolution on smoking ban in all public places to support city ordinance August 2007.
- 4. Presented a resolution regarding coal generated plants in Texas June 2007, as water quality and pollution issues continued to surface in particular from carbon producing companies and their health impact.
- 5. A panel presentation by experts was provided to the BRC on water quality and health care by Texas Commission for Environmental Quality, Health Department, Environmental and utilities Department so the BRC could understand water quality and health issues and make recommendations.
- 6. Health Department presented an overview on public health and health care access priorities (current issues, new and emerging issues) for the BRC to provide recommendations.
- 7. A recommendation was given to update a resource directory, particularly on health care access especially as we continued to face barriers in recruitment and retention of providers.
- 8. Presentation by the County Indigent Program was provided to discuss indigent care resources, Medicaid and provider reimbursement.
- 9. Health Department provided an epidemiological profile and overview of health in Laredo and presented priority areas Infectious Diseases, Mental health and Substance Abuse. The presentation included an overview of the following: underinsured, adolescent health, mental health, and substance abuse, infections diseases, wellness and disease control and chronic diseases (rates, morbidity and mortality) as well new and emerging issues including public health emergency preparedness (chemical exposure, dug resistance, cancer, diabetes.)
- 10. BRC was asked by Mayor to assist with the Pediatric Cancer Support Group team led by the health Department, immediate clarification was provided on local resources support for children especially lab testing in Laredo to reduce the amount of trips to San Antonio for oncology visits. In addition, both cancer institutes provided guidance and support to families.
- 11. BRC developed priorities areas of concern; 1) health care access (uninsured, health professions need, retention and recruitment); 2) water quality and infectious diseases and 3) mental health and substance abuse.
- 12. Through the health Department a stakeholder meeting was conducted with the Substance Abuse and Mental health Services Administration (SAMSHA) Center for Substance Abuse Prevention to provide federal officials on the needs for resources in this area.
- 13. Dr. Keene and Dr. Gonzalez met with County Judge Danny Valdez, Indigent Care Services Director Frank Salinas as well as other staff to discuss indigent care and

- joint City/County efforts, with a formal presentation to County Commissioners Court to formally partner as the City/County Blue Ribbon Committee on Health Issues.
- 14. Met to discuss new steps and discussed an assessment to address both current and future health needs and after meeting with university of Texas Health Science Center staff/Dr. Adela Gonzalez, Executive Director of South Texas Programs, the BRC moved to conduct a comprehensive community/county wide health assessment.

Committee members approached Congressman Cuellar for assistance, \$200,000 has been promised for the assessment which will cover health professions, indigent care and prevention, wellness, environmental health hospital care, mental health, and allied health, dental care and potential research needs.
