37. Power Generation by a Municipality 38. Preservation of City Authority and Comp. Bob Strauser and Allen Howell gave a report as to what is taking place in Austin and in Washington D. C. at the state and federal levels regarding the City of Laredo.

Cm. Garcia congratulated Jose Flores' daughter for doing an outstanding job by participating in a one act play for UIL. Kassandra Flores, the daughter of Jose Flores, was named best actress.

Cm. Landeck expressed a desire to equalize the amenities throughout the City of Laredo.

Cm. Rendon requested permission to play a thirty second video about vandalism in the City of Laredo parks.

Cm. Belmares congratulated Keith Selman, Planning Director, for his work on the legislation and the language that was put into the Rail and Public Transportation bill.

Cm. Chavez said that is working hard to address important issues regarding the rail bridge and rail road blockage.

Mayor Pro Tempore Ramirez said that had a meeting regarding the 4th of July celebration. He said that he also met with the San Bernardo Merchants who is organizing a Cinco De Mayo celebration along San Bernardo street. He mentioned the 4th Annual Cesar Chavez March for Justice. He expressed his dissatisfaction with the vandalism video that was produced by Parks. He said that he would like to see the vandals being arrested so vandals can learn that there is a stiff penalty for vandalizing property.

Mayor Salinas advised that he traveled to Nuevo Laredo with the County Judge Danny Valdez. He said that it was a very fruitful trip and the officials of the city were very appreciative for the meeting. He noted that one of the issues was to include a very friendly effort in promoting Laredo. He added that it would behoove all city residents for everyone to demonstrate that the City is a wonderful place to live. He read the following letter addressing Bill Maher who is a HBO Real Time with Bill Naher:

"I write to express my overall frustration with the overwhelmingly negative media coverage our community has sustained that sensationalizes and exaggerates the problems faced by our Mexican sister city of Nuevo Laredo, and of Laredo, Texas in the March 16, 2007 program entitled Real Time with Bill Maher, where Mr. Maher exchanges comments with Dan Rather about his trip to Nuevo Laredo, Mexico and their next comments that Nuevo Laredo is a "bad neighborhood" to visit and that necessarily implies Laredo, Texas is also a "bad Neighborhood".

Laredo has suffered enough. This is a safe, law-abiding city with one of the highest growth rates in the nation and a lot going for it including international trade and tourism.

The mere mention of Laredo being across the border from Nuevo Laredo profligates the perception among U. S. media market consumers that the problems faced by Nuevo Laredo are also being faced in Laredo today. This is both untrue and therefore unfair. I am compelled to express to you that the good name of Laredo, Texas is being dragged down by just this type of flighty, thoughtless dialogue. This is an unfortunate side effect of what is dealt with for too long.

The City of Laredo, Texas proudly embraces its culture, heritage, and wonderful Mexican influences on this region and our community. As a mayor, I fully acknowledge the harsh realities facing our sister city and the tragedy they have dealt with in the immediate past. Having said that, there is also a distinct different between the U. S. and Mexico.

Laredo, Texas has seen a decline in its violent crime statistics and static activity since 2003. The Laredo Police Department (LPD) is the only local agency in the region with full time police officers assigned to work inside federal agencies. LPD has 18 reports since 2002 of Laredoans missing in Mexico. These are the undeniable facts surrounding the reality of Laredo, Texas.

It is bothersome that you mention only one law enforcement official from this area, when in fact 98% of the population in Webb County lives within the city limits. I did not hear a source referenced representing this agency. Keeping the local law enforcement agency engaged in this dialogue is critical to having an accurate and total understanding of the reality of Laredo, that by contrast shows how safe and secure out city truly is.

The City of Laredo should not have to tolerate further insult. I am open to talking about the facts of the tough realities that face our neighboring country and to tell you more about Laredo's wonderful state of affairs and its bright future. In this appeal, I ask for equal time to relate the truth about Laredo, Texas and tell the nation more about his great community in the United States of America."

Cm. Garcia recommended for Council to reduce their discussion items to four per months or to place a time limit on the items that are allowed per City Council meetings. He also suggested ending the meetings at ten o'clock with an option to extend to 10:30 p.m. He noted that it may be exhausting for some Council Members to be addressing important issues at late hours.

Cm. Rendon said that the recent discussion items have extended the meetings to 11:00 p.m.; however, most meeting are not lengthy.

Cm. Garza explained that there are several Council Members that are still learning which allows for more time for discussion. He suggested having all recognitions at a particular meeting.

C. Request by Council Member Dr. Michael Landeck

1. Discussion with possible action on water issues. (Co-sponsored by Council Member Mike Garza)

A. Strategic plan on a possible water infrastructure upgrade (major items, timetable and estimated cost).

Adrian Montemayor, Utilities Department, explained that the City of Laredo Utilities Department does have a strategic plan that is developed into the Capital Improvement Plan which extends out for a five year period. The plan establishes all of the Capital projects that are necessary to advance with the water system. In addition to those, there are additional critical projects that are being evaluated separate from the Capital Improvement Program. One example of an item that is still in the process of determining the cost and extent of it is the expectations to do a line replacement program which include line replacements of 2% of the existing line infrastructure starting with the small size lines all the way up to the larger size lines. The City of Laredo has approximately 600 miles of water lines underground into the infrastructure which consists of 60 % of the assets in the water system. In the process of developing a replacement plan it will allow them an opportunity to go in and increase sizes and increase the integrity of the lines. Staff is recommending that 2%, which will give them a fifty year replacement plan on all the water lines. He continued to say that the City has been established a 25% unaccounted for water. The five year plan includes a line replacement project to replace 3,500 linear feet of water line. At the end of five year the City will have accomplished the necessary improvements that they have been told are needed through the Master Planning process to meet the growth demands as well as replacements. Finally, he said that he would return to Council within forty five days with an update on the plan.

B. Possible replacement of all mechanical water meters to electronic based meters (including possible timetable, cost of meters and reduction in manual water meter reading cost.)

Elizabeth Martinez, Tax Collector/Assessor, informed Council that staff has been addressing this issue and the total cost of replacing all of the equipment is first 57,600 meters with a meter interface unit that is placed on the current meters and the cost is \$5 million dollars. Then the City of Laredo would need to contract a service that would do the installation because the individuals that replace the meters must be certified. The cost would be an additional \$1.4 million. The City needs to locate gateways in different parts of the city and one would

accommodate 1,500 meters and based on that it would cost an additional \$152,000. The City would need to purchase an annual license which is \$29,484 which would be paid on going yearly. The total cost to convert to electronic based meters is \$6.6 million dollars.

C. Addition of \$5 Million to current budget for immediate active search and acquisition of Water rights.

Cynthia Collazo, Acting City Manager, asked Council to authorize the City Manager to initiate a process that would allow him/her to return to Council with acquisition recommendations that would allow the Council to agree or disagree with water rights.

Rosario Cabello, Finance Director, explained that there are ten million dollars for the acquisition of water rights. She explained that staff would need to initiate a public hearing to be able to appropriate monies from the fund balance.

Cm. Belmares explained that the current funds for the water are monies that are accumulations of development community monies that have been paid by the developers for water availability and have been earmarked specifically for the acquisition for water rights. As developers pay for water availability which are assessed by lot basis. The monies that have been accumulated are \$13,000,000, and \$3,000,000 is encumbered for the City rights. The funds are not for water conservation unless the City of Laredo City Council change the system.

Cm. Landeck expressed his desire for staff to aggressively seek water rights.

Cm. Garcia explained that the City of Laredo staff has been following directions that have been given to them by prior City Council members. He noted that if Council wishes to change their direction then they should be allowed to do so but Staff should not be held responsible for the delay in obtaining water rights.

Motion to aggressively seek water rights and pay no more than \$2,300 per municipal acre and authorize the City Manager to enter into earnest money or any other contractual and bring it back to council for final approval.

XI. STAFF REPORTS

8. A. Status report by Elizabeth Alonzo, Laredo Municipal Housing Corporation Executive Director, regarding the Noise Compatibility Rental Program.

Elizabeth Alonzo, Executive Director of Laredo Municipal Housing Corporation, explained that on January 16, 2007 the City Council introduced two ordinances to reduce rates within the noise abatement program which would address the 70% occupancy. City Council also instructed staff to return to Council with an update on the occupancy. The Director reported that the vacancy rates have been reduced after the reduction of rental rates. The occupancy rate for a single property home as of March 2007 is 99%. In January 2007 the multi-property rate was 51% and on March 2007 the rate is 90%.

A. Staff report by Miguel A. Pescador, Parks and Recreation Department Director, regarding Slaughter Park, with possible action.

Miguel Pescador, Parks & Recreation Director, gave a comprehensive report on the proposed changes of the Slaughter Park. He gave a PowerPoint presentation which explained all of the changes.

*The PowerPoint presentation is available for review at the City Secretary's Office.

General Overview

The City of Laredo contracted with the park planning firm of Land Design Partners (in conjunction with Ashley Humphries & Sanchez Architects and Arcadis G & M, Inc.) for the design and construction document preparation – and realization – of the Slaughter Park.

Original Master Plan was prepared in September of 2005.

Purpose of the update: Apprise council on the proposed master plan update and

receive comments regarding the master plan update.

Cm. Rendon expressed his concern regarding securing in the park area.

Cm. Landeck requested for staff to consider placing a police sub-station or surveillance cameras at the Slaughter Park.

Chief Dovalina noted that the police sub-station has not been considered and that if they do place a substation at the park that he would need additional personnel.

Cm. Garza instructed staff to search for additional funds for surveillance cameras.

Miguel Pescardo, Parks & Recreation Director, reminded Council that they instructed staff to focus on soccer parks for the Slaughter Park.

Laredo Independent School District has a \$27.6 million dollar levy and only 9.4 % utilize the split payment option. LISD collects \$2.6 million utilizing that option. In the case of Webb County they have a \$56 million dollar levy and only 2.2% utilize the split payment option. Two significant reasons why entities do not offer the split payment is because 25% of all levies are paid by mortgage companies. Also businesses that own their businesses choose to pay by December 31 so they can take the same deduction on their income tax.
