29. Presentation by U.S. Customs and authorizing the City Manager to enter into a License Contract with U.S. Customs for the placement of License plates readers on city right-of-way.

George St. Claire, Program Officer for U.S. Customs and officer in charge of the license plate reader program, said that U.S. Customs and I.N.S. (Immigration and Naturalization Service) have received funding of \$35 million to set up automated plate readers in every crossing in the Southwest border. The automated plate readers will be used for both in-bound and outbound traffic. The main purpose of this program is to increase enforcement capabilities. Getting the license plate numbers of people coming and going will greatly increase apprehension of drug smugglers. Also, they expect to make a big dent in stolen cars leaving the country. Mr. St. Claire added that this program is nationally funded and nationally maintained. If council gives their approval, the installation of the system will be done in September or October and whatever is required to have a safe installation.

A video depicting how the APR system (automated plate reading system) works was shown to council. Mr. Claire then said, that they are asking the City to agree in principle to allow them to put the system on the City's streets going out-of-town prior to the toll booths. Once an agreement in principle is made, then they can discuss with the City as to where exactly the readers will be installed, what problems there might be, and the data sharing which will be offered to law enforcement. He added that they are developing a vehicle counter system which works off of the sensor beams. The City may request this information to be shared so that it may serve to audit the bridge traffic totals.

# IX. STAFF REPORTS

32. Quarterly report to the City Council by the Laredo Convention and Visitor's Bureau.

Don Raulie, C&V Director, reported in reference to visitors guide used for promotional efforts. He said that the edition was printed in November 1998 and is still being used this year. They are in the process of developing specifications for the new guide. There are a number of changes that they plan to incorporate into the guide such as more information about Nuevo Laredo, more ads featuring Nuevo Laredo businesses, portions of the text will be in Spanish, increasing the number of copies that will be produced (by about 35%), plus additional copies

will be distributed in Mexico.

In addition, they are working with the office of tourism in Nuevo Laredo in the development of information and they will be responsible for the distribution of the guide in Mexico.

He spoke in reference to the Millennium Celebration. He said they have held informal meetings with people who have an interest in putting together some sort of a celebration for the city. City officials from Laredo/Nuevo Laredo have met to discuss the possibility of a joint effort/joint celebration that would take place on the eve of the new millennium. Things discussed include a major fiesta in the business districts of both cities, an international bridge ceremony, and a fireworks demonstration that would take place on the border. People invited to the meeting included customs, immigration, bridge officials, and police from both cities. The intent was to bring all those people together to discuss any concerns that they might have about the plans for that evening.

Next, he spoke of the position statement and said that the advisory board adopted a position last month which formally establishes the "Gateway to Mexico" as a slogan that will be used in all our advertising and promotional materials.

He also mentioned that an important point that developed during that process was a focus on our Laredo's rich heritage as a promotional resource. As they looked around the community to determine what there was about Laredo that people might be interested in coming to see, they did not find any beaches or major theme parks, but what they found was an enormous rich history.

He also reported that they are trying to establish a new "Welcome" billboard on the north side of town and they are still working on the project.

He noted that our inquiries are still running significantly ahead of last year. While they are only expressions of interest, nevertheless it is a good indication of interest to travel into the City of Laredo.

Cm. Guerra asked if they have any figures as to how much tourism is actually coming into the city.

Mr. Raulie said they will bring a report on the number of meetings and conventions held in Laredo, plus a report on group tourists with their next report.

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They are in the process of developing a marketing plan and will have a draft ready to show the advisory board on August 4th.

The study includes hydrological and hydraulic data for the submittal of a letter of Map Revision (LOMR) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency which will establish a storm water information database identifying hydraulic structures in the floodplain, develop a Flood Protection Plan including proposed regulations for structural improvements, and will provide the City with a computer model to plan the scheduled maintenance of stream beds and structures.

John Acevedo, from Brown & Root Services, made the presentation before the council. He showed watershed and hydrology maps, and explained that other tributaries were studied plus gave an overview of the 10-year storm, 25-year storm, 50-year and the 100-year storm events. He gave an overview of discharges and quantities that we are dealing with and explained the following tables.

1) Flood Insurance Study Update.

This study will be used to up date and enhance the existing Flood Insurance Study information dated May 17, 1982 for portions of Chacon Creek and five (5) tributaries within the City and County jurisdictional boundaries. The detailed study streams consist of:

- 1) Chacon Creek, from the Rio Grande River to Lake Casablanca
- 2) Tributary No. 1, to Chacon Creek
- 3) Tributary No. 2, to Chacon Creek
- 4) Tributary No. 3, to Chacon Creek

# 2) Master Drainage Plan

A) Interim (Existing) Development Condition

The Interim Drainage Plan provides the recommended improvement plan for each channel to relieve the existing flooding conditions identified in the Updated Flood Insurance Study. Included are the preliminary construction costs for implementation. This estimate did not include the costs associated with the acquisition of the right-of-way requirements for the channel improvements. These improvements are consistent with the Future Development Drainage Plan improvements for the different channels. The table below presents the summary of the preliminary construction cost estimates for implementing the Interim Drainage Plan for each of the different channel system. These costs are in addition to the Future Development Master Drainage Plan recommendations.

# B) Future Development Condition

The Future Development Drainage Plan provides the recommended improvement plan for each channel in order to accommodate the 100-year discharge resulting from the full development conditions within each watershed. Included are the preliminary construction costs for implementation. These improvements are consistent with the Interim Drainage Plan improvements for the different channels. The following table presents the summary of the preliminary construction cost estimates for implementing the Future Development Master Drainage Plan for each of the different channel systems. These costs are in addition to those in the Interim Drainage Plan.

There was lengthy discussion on how the drainage improvements, including building a new water retention facility were to be incorporated. Also, one of the remarks made was that development should not be allowed in the high flooding areas.

Mr. Acevedo stated that some alternatives for the improvement of Chacon Creek include a detention pond on Lake Casa Blanca, earthen, and channalization. Currently most channels are fully

vegetated, so clearing the channels from bank to bank would reduce the flood level approximately one half to one-foot. Regarding the bridges, the recommendation is to salvage three bridges and replace four. Out of the four, one is included in TxDOT's project for US 59, and another one near HWY 359, can possibly be include with another TxDOT project.

Cm. Guerra requested from the Engineering Department to review the information provided by the Brown & Root Study and see if the information is adequate.

Florencio Pena, City Manager, said that the Brown and Root Study provides the baseline data needed for our three creeks: Chacon, Zacate, and Manadas. Also, it would help us to develop a plan to handle those basins more efficiently, and to give direction to the developers on how these areas should be developed. In the meantime, staff will evaluate the information provided by the study and probably come with its recommendation in two weeks.

# XI. CITY COUNCIL PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

37. Requests by Mayor and City Council members for presentation and discussion.

# A. Request by Mayor Elizabeth G. Flores

1. Presentation and status report by the Citizens Environmental Committee.

Maria Eugenia Guerra, Chair of Citizens Environmental Committee, said that the committee had met for the last several months to start designing the scope of their work. However, some meetings have not been successful because of they lacked quorum. She asked Councilmembers to contact their appointees and see if their appointee is interested and willing to participate in this committee meetings.

Ms. Guerra then gave a overview of the committee's general focus which is to watch over all aspects of the environment, such as water, air, soil, watershed, wildlife, wetlands, and native vegetation as they are affected by industrial, commercial and residential

development. She also mentioned that the committee believes that the City of Laredo should serve as a model of environmental best practices, on water, resource conservation, and recycling.

The committee is in the process of writing and revising ordinances to safeguard the watershed and environment in this region. Also, the committee is working with the City's environmental engineer to make ready the water pollution prevention ordinance that EPA has mandated pursuant to the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. The ordinance that the committee will be delivering to council will have stringent standards and definitions and will set minimum standards for protecting the environment. There must be a balance within the needs of the environment and the needs of the business community.

### B. Request by Council member Louis H. Bruni

1. Request for a legal opinion from the City Attorney on the City's authority to enforce any and all oil and gas City Ordinances within the City's Extra Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) with possible action.

City Attorney, Jaime Flores, stated that the short answer on enforcing our city ordinances in the ETJ is "no", however he understands the concern with regards to conveying the city's concern with the development of oil and gas industry in our ETJ and its impact. He said he will explore what we can do in this regard with the Senator and with the Railroad Commissioner in terms of conveying those concerns to see what kind of controls or what kind of enforcement there is besides the city ordinance. He added that the Texas Government Code allows us to regulate the city ordinances and said that the state law allows just platting, therefore there isn't a state law that enables regulation of oil/gas in the ETJ. He will explore the issue and will deliver a written response.

Cm. Guerra also spoke of another concern, whereby some producers refuse to plug the wells after they have stopped producing because of the language in our city ordinances.

Cm. Bruni asked that the City Manager and the City Attorney petition the Railroad Commissioner and tell them that there are safety concerns out there, the well has been depleted, but all natural gas wells even if depleted have lingering gas and down hole pressure which presents a safety concern. He asked that they petition the Railroad Commission to force this oil and gas company to abandon their well because it presents a safety concern, it is not feasible to produce, and the surface owners cannot reclaim their prime real estate.

Mayor Flores asked that the City Attorney pursue on this issue and get in touch with the Railroad Commission to see what can be done and advise council on the update status.

2. Status report with possible action on the progress of filling the Airport Marketing position at the Laredo International Airport.

Jose Flores, Airport Director, reported that they have stopped recruiting and have 24 applications. He now has a list of seven applicants and hopefully by the latter part of this week they will shorten the list down to three and have interviews the first part of next week. He concluded by saying that the position might be filled by no later than the middle part of next week.

3. City Council discussion and action to rescind and reconsider the motion passed by Council on June 21, 1999 regarding the Saunders U.S. 59 median and to reconsider TXDOT's proposed median with possible action.

Fitzgerald Sanchez, TxDOT, stated that there are some concerns by some area businesses with building a raised median in that area. He emphasized that the median will be a safety measure for that area since there are many businesses and a lot of traffic. Furthermore, it is anticipated that the vehicular traffic will increase due to the new hospital. And, because of the new hospital, there would be a number of people crossing the street, so the raised median would provide them a refuge for those pedestrians.

Mr. Sanchez pointed out that Barlett has the highest number of accidents. The issue of vehicles exiting the post office (at Saunders) was addressed and the median will prevent vehicles exiting the post office to turn left. On the HEB's (at Saunders) issue, he said that TXDOT is aligning HEB's driveway with Milmo St. This will enable vehicles to exit into Hwy 59 without getting crossed in the left turn way. Other driveways at Jarvis Street will also be realigned, and the issue regarding the vacant K-Mart driveway was also addressed. Mr. Sanchez feels that most of the risks have been considerably reduced.

There was a lengthy discussion on whether to approve the original plan or make some minor revision to it. Mr. Pena said that Commerce Bank, TXDOT, and planning staff got together and discussed two basic alternatives. For instance, one was to connect by Mercy Hospital and provide a frontage road. Because TXDOT obtained federal funds for this project, only minor changes can be made to the original proposed plans since those were the plans approved.
